

What is a concussion?

Concussions are a type of traumatic brain injury (TBI) that can be caused by a direct hit to the head or by a hit to the body causing the head and neck to whiplash.

- + Most concussions occur without the loss of consciousness.
- Athletes who have, at any point in their lives, had a concussion have an increased risk for another concussion.
- + Young children and teens are more likely to get a concussion and take longer to recover than adults.
- + Athletes with a personal or family history of migraines also take longer to recover.

Know how to recognize concussion signs and symptoms.

Signs

- Dazed, confused or stunned
- + Memory loss
- + Slow to respond
- + Unusually tired
- Unusually sad or irritable
- Nausea

Symptoms

- + Headache
- + Nauseous and vomiting
- + Double or blurry vision
- + Sensitivity to light and/or noise
- + Extreme fatigue
- + Academic decline
